Richard Norton Smith returns to West Branch on Friday, August 10 to share stories and reminiscences about American Presidents.

Between 1987 and 2001, Smith lead and established several presidential libraries. He was Director of the Herbert Hoover Presidential Library and Museum. He then worked for the Dwight D. Eisenhower Presidential Museum in Kansas; the Ronald Reagan Presidential Museum in Simi Valley, California; the Gerald R. Ford Presidential Museum in Grand Rapids, Michigan and Gerald R. Ford Presidential Library in Ann Arbor, Michigan.

In 2001 Smith became director of the Robert J. Dole Institute of Politics at the University of Kansas. In October 2003, he was appointed Founding Director of the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum in Illinois.

Currently Smith is a Scholar-in-Residence in History and Public Policy at George Mason University in Washington, DC, and is a frequent commentator on C-SPAN and The PBS NewsHour.

Also join us on Saturday, August 11 at 1:00 p.m. as the 50th Anniversary Celebration continues with panel discussions involving past directors, including Smith, former staff and friends of the library-museum.
